



SBYSF Grant Request Guidelines and Application

Purpose

Financial Grants available through the Santa Barbara Youth Sailing Foundation (SBYSF) are meant to assist SBYSF Sailors with participation in sailing events outside of local and regional sailing. Awards from \$100 to \$600 are available. The following events will be considered;

- **InterScholastic Sailing Association (ISSA) Events**
 - Singlehanded Championship (Cressy)
 - Doublehanded Championship (Mallory)
 - Team Race Championship (Baker)
- **U.S. Sailing Events**
 - Youth Sailing Championship
 - Jr. Women's Single-handed Nationals (Leiter Cup)
 - Jr. Women's Double-handed Championship (Ida Lewis)
 - Youth Multi-hull Championships (Hoyt/Jolly Cup)
 - Jr. Single-handed qualifier & championship (Smythe)
 - Jr. Double-handed qualifier & championship (Bemis)
 - Jr. Triple-handed qualifier & championship (Sears)
- **ISAF World Youth Championship**
- **National, North American, and World Championships in any class**
- **Orange Bowl Regatta**
- **Special/Other events may be funded, "ask"**

Grant Request Guidelines

The following parameters have been set forth by the SBYSF Board of Directors as the minimum criteria to be met by SBYSF Sailors wishing to apply for a financial Grant. Individuals may submit the following documents to apply for a grant up to 30 days following the event:

- A complete Application
- A resume of sailing training and experience
- A list of anticipated expenses for the event (entry/registration, travel, charter, food, housing, etc.)
- A signed SBYSF Code of Conduct.
- A minimum 200 word written Regatta Report. This report should include: a summary of the event, result, photos, and any other information.

Selection Process

Grant awards will be based on several factors, including but not limited to funds available, number of requests received and needs of the applicant. A maximum of 3 Grant awards are available per sailor in a given calendar year. Applicants may apply multiple grants towards one regatta.

Conduct and Obligations

- Grantees will be asked to be ambassadors for SBYSF, SBYC and to the sport of sailing. Sailors should be mature and demonstrate a high regard for personal responsibility.
- Grantees actions, both on and off the water, reflect on them as well as the SBYSF and SBYC. Applicants shall conduct themselves in a sportsman like manner.
 - Be cooperative, supportive and respectful of other people and their property.
 - Sail within the Racing Rules of Sailing.
 - Be gracious in victory or defeat.
- As a condition of receiving an SBYSF Grant, Grantees may be asked to provide a written article about their experience in the event and pictures for the Scuttlebutt and/or the SBYSF website or Facebook page.
- In addition, Grantees may be asked to give back to their SBYSF sailing community through participation in dock cleanup days, coach boat maintenance and by helping with Clinigattas and other SBYSF events.
